



Karen Schull MacGee

A 1957 graduate of Kansas City's Southwest High School and the University of Kansas (1961), **Karen Schull McGee** began as a junior player under the knowledgeable eye of Blue Hills pro and 2013 Hall of Fame inductee, Leland "Duke" Gibson.

While at Kansas, she competed in the Women's Intercollegiate (the forerunner of today's NCAA tournament) at Ann Arbor, Michigan finishing as runner-up in 1961 (one down through 36 holes). That same year she advanced to the quarter-finals of the US Women's Amateur. After college she continued playing golf at Blue Hills, Indian Hills and later at Brookridge.



There is an interesting symmetry to her golfing accomplishments: twelve Kansas City championships balanced against twelve state championships in Kansas (5) and Missouri (7).

After her 1980 Kansas City Match Play win, Mrs. MacGee opted to pursue her career in nursing and ended her competitive golfing ambitions. For an unprecedented period, from 1958 to 1980, she was "the one to beat" in the Kansas City area.

Recognizing more than two decades of dominance on the local golf scene the Board of Directors is proud to include Karen Schull MacGee in the 2014 class of the Kansas City Golf Hall of Fame.
